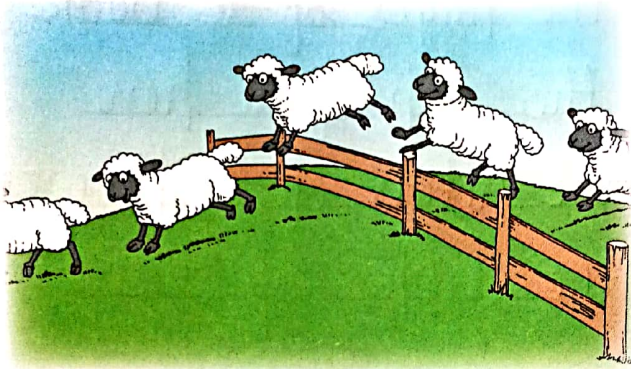
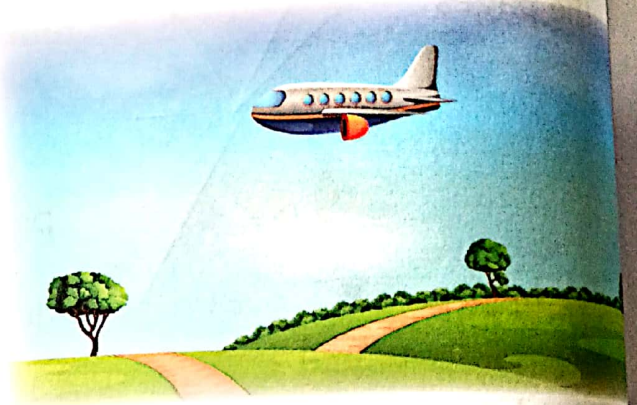


# Over

The preposition **over** is used to describe the movement of something or someone at a higher position as compared to another thing. **Over** is also used to describe the crossing of someone or something from one end to the other.

Examples: Naina held the books over her head.

We jumped over the hurdle.

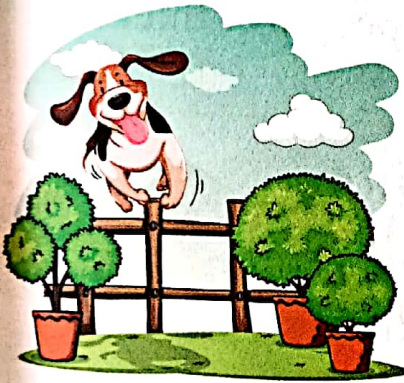
