

Ram Narayan Singh

He was a famous freedom fighter of Jharkhand, who was born on 9 December 1885 in Hunterganj Tetaria village of Chatra district. His father's name was Bholi Singh who was himself a freedom fighter. His cousin Sukhlal Singh was also a great freedom fighter. Another freedom fighter Shaligram Singh was also born on 24 July 1916 in Hunterganj. Hunterganj block has been renamed as Ramnarayan Shaligrampur in honor of these two freedom fighters.

During the non-cooperation movement, he provided leadership to Chatra (at that time in Hazaribagh) district and also went to jail for one month. Ram Narayan Singh led Chatra district in the Salt Movement, Civil Disobedience Movement and Quit India Movement. He was the President of the Hazaribagh District Congress Committee. Gandhiji addressed Ramnarayan Singh as "Chhotanagpur Kesari (Lion of Chotanagpur)" during the Ramgarh Congress session.

Swaraj Loot Gya

In 1956 he wrote the famous book called "Swaraj Loot Gaya". This book is called the Code of Conduct of Politics.

Along with Santal social reformers and freedom fighters Opam Manjhi and Bangam Majhi, it did a lot of work in the field of

social reform. Ram Narayan Singh was also elected a member of the Constituent Assembly.

He was a member of the Constitution Making Committee of the Constituent Assembly. After independence, he broke away from the Congress because he was not happy with the foreign policy of the Congress. In the first general election of 1952, he became the first MP from Hazaribagh as an independent candidate. Ram Narayan Singh was the first leader who advocated a separate Jharkhand for the first time in Parliament. He died in a car accident on 24 June 1964.

Important facts about Ramnarayan Singh

1. Ram Narayan Singh was imprisoned in Hazaribagh Jail during the Quit India Movement. An incident happened in the same jail on 9 November 1942. Jayaprakash Narayan along with his 5 companions escaped from the prison wall. Those five companions were:-

- a). Ram Nandan Mishra
- b) Pink Sonar
- c) Shaligram Singh
- d) Suraj Narayan Singh
- e) Yogendra Shukla

Soon after this incident, Ramnarayan Singh, Krishna Vallabh Sahai and Sukhlal Singh, who were imprisoned in the same jail, were shifted from Hazaribagh Jail to Bhagalpur Jail.

2. Ramnarayan Singh was a lawyer by profession.
